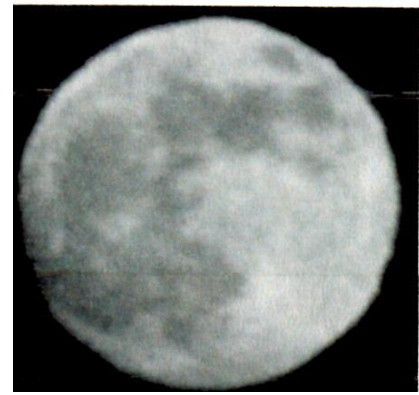


JOIN THE PARTY

Introduce your child and yourself to the rabbit in the moon. Join our Neighborhood Moon Rabbit Watch Party on April 7



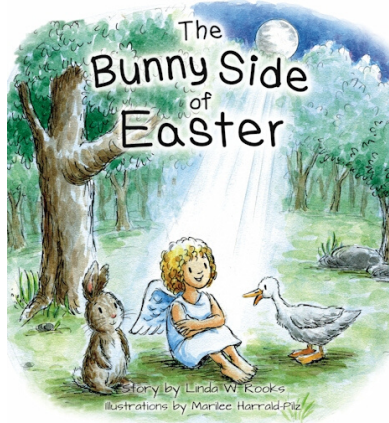
It's a Prelude to Easter with social distancing intact.
